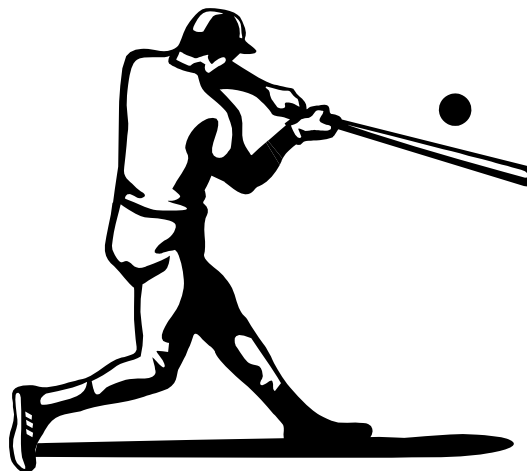

EAGLE ELEMENTARY'S DISCIPLINE POLICY

The Sporting Good Behavior Plan is a school wide discipline system that is used in all classrooms (grades K-5), in special classes, and at lunch and recess.

This system works like a three strikes plan. If a student earns three strikes, the strikes become an out. Strikes are minor infractions while outs are more serious infractions. The consequences for students are outlined and posted in every classroom.

Another component of the Sporting Good Behavior Plan addresses responsibility. Students will earn fouls for not turning in assignments on time, not having a parent signature on appropriate documents, etc. Five fouls in a week will result in a before-school detention.

We feel this discipline plan allows students, teachers, and parents to understand the importance of appropriate behavior for school. Students know classroom expectations and understand the consequences for inappropriate behavior.

FOULS, STRIKES AND OUTS

Fouls: Responsibility Rules

- Not prepared for class
 - Missing assignment
 - Signed slip not returned
- 5 fouls = before-school detention*
Fouls begin new each week.

Strikes

Students receive strikes for the following:

- Excessive talking without permission
- Recess behavior
- Hallway behavior
- Lunchroom behavior
- Bathroom behavior
- Not following directions
- Off task
- Not respecting others' space
- Inappropriate behavior

Strikes begin new each day.

Outs

Students receive an out if they receive three (3) strikes in class or for any one of the following:

- Disrespectful to Others
- Inappropriate Language
- Destruction of School Property
- Lying or Cheating
- Disrupting Class

Outs begin new each semester.

Consequences for Outs

When a student receives a discipline referral they are immediately sent to the office.

Possible consequences include:

- Warning from the office
- Before School Detention
- Parents and Student to meet with the Discipline Committee to find resolution
- In School Suspension
- Possible Out of School Suspension

Handbook Violations

The Student Handbook outlines possible consequences for student behaviors that violate handbook policies regarding fighting, possession of drugs or controlled substances, causing injury to school personnel, weapons violations, sexual behavior, harassment and threats, bullying, theft, illegal activity, or tobacco use.

Administration has the right to determine the severity of each consequence.
