By missing the March 10 FAFSA deadline for Indiana students, 27 high school graduates in a county similar to yours and attending a popular Indiana public university in a recent year missed out on over \$100,000 in state grant assistance. Had they filed their forms by the March 10 FAFSA filing deadline, these students would have received an average of about \$4,000 each in state grant money. Don't let it happen to you!

Student Documents Needed for Completion of the FAFSA (bring them with you!)

- Student Social Security Number or Alien Registration Number (permanent resident)
- Student Driver's License Number (if available)
- Student untaxed income information
- Student W-2 & 1040 EZ, 1040A or 1040 tax forms
- Student current bank statements & investment information

Parent(s)/Stepparent (where you live) Documents Needed for Completion of the FAFSA

- Social Security numbers for parent(s)
- Parent W-2 & 1040A or 1040 tax forms
- Untaxed income information (child support, housing allowance, other untaxed income)
- Current bank statements and investment information

You are an Independent Student and Do Not Need Parent Information if:

- You were born before January 1, 1987
- You are married as of the date you file the FAFSA
- You already have a Bachelor's Degree (four-year degree)
- You are currently serving on active duty or are a Veteran of the U. S. Armed Forces
- You have a dependent for whom you provide more than half the financial support
- You are currently an emancipated minor determined by a court in Indiana or were an emancipated minor until you turned age 18
- At age 13 or older, both your parents were deceased or you were in foster care or you were a dependent/ward of the court or you currently have a legal guardian (other than a biological parent) in Indiana
- At any time on or after July 1, 2009 were you a homeless or unaccompanied youth as determined by the school district homeless liaison or the director of homeless or runaway emergency shelter
