



BCSC 2022-23 RESPONSIVE MEASURES

NO CHANGES FROM THE END OF 2021-2022

There have been no changes to the responsive measures that were in place at the end of the 2021-2022 school year.

MASKS ARE OPTIONAL AT BCSC

Masks are optional for students, staff and visitors in indoor spaces on the BCSC campus. The federal mandate from the Department of Transportation has expired and masks are no longer required on BCSC buses. This includes extra-curricular bus travel.

ADDITIONAL SAFETY MEASURES

ELEMENTARY

- Hand sanitizer stations remain available in common areas and classrooms
- Students with COVID-19 symptoms will be treated in a separate area of the clinic
- No visitors are allowed at lunch

MIDDLE & HIGH SCHOOL

- Hand sanitizer stations remain available in common areas and classrooms
 - Students with COVID-19 symptoms will be treated in a separate area of the clinic
 - Middle School will continue to have expanded lunch periods due to construction project at West and shared staff between secondary buildings
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SYMPTOM SCREENING

As directed by the Indiana Department of Health (IDoH), if your child is experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 (latest symptom list below) they should stay home from school and their primary care provider should be contacted. If your child has symptoms of COVID-19, they should stay home from school until their symptoms are improving and they have been fever-free (without fever-reducing medicine) for 24 hours.

Symptoms of COVID-19 include (most recent update from CDC, 8/11/22): fever or chills, sore throat, cough, especially new onset uncontrolled cough, or any cough causing shortness of breath or difficulty breathing (for students with chronic allergic/ asthmatic cough, a change in their cough from baseline), diarrhea, nausea, vomiting, new onset of severe headache, new loss of taste or smell, fatigue, and muscle or body aches.

WHAT IF STUDENT/STAFF TESTS POSITIVE

This individual should return to school only if the following conditions are met:

- The person's symptoms are resolving without fever-reducing medication for 24 hours (if symptomatic)
 - At least 5 calendar days have passed since symptoms first appeared or have passed with no symptoms
 - They wear a mask on day 6-10 per CDC recommendation
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EXPOSURE AT SCHOOL - QUARANTINE INFORMATION

On February 16, 2022, the Indiana Department of Health announced that they are no longer recommending contact tracing and quarantining in schools. It was also announced that schools no longer need to report any COVID-19 case information to the IDoH and that the school dashboard will be discontinued.
